

2019 Kansas QSO Party Certificate and Stamps

Awarded to stations spelling KANSAS, SUNFLOWER, QSOPARTY or YELLOWBRICKROAD during the Kansas QSO Party using the last letter of the 1x1 calls you work. To be eligible, you must send in a log file to logs@ksqsoparty.org. Then send an email with the following information to kansas150@hotmail.com: call, name, address, city, state, zip, email. Put STAMPS and your call sign in the subject header. **You DON'T have to turn in the checklist below.**

Select one stamp for each word you spell up to TWO. Spelling YELLOWBRICKROAD earns you a bonus stamp for a total maximum of three stamps. Spelling one word plus YELLOWBRICKROAD still earns you three stamps! The stamps are shown at the end of the Rules.

We will check your log against the 1x1 station logs and send you your stamp(s) and display cover(s). If you don't already have a certificate, you will be given instructions on how to download your certificate. If you want us to print and mail your certificate with stamps attached, see the Rules. Indicate which of the stamp(s) you would like in order of preference. If we run out of a particular stamp, we reserve the right to substitute a different one. **You may collect stamps until we have sent you all nine stamps.**

1. 1960 Echo I stamp
 2. 1964 Amateur Radio stamp
 3. 1967 Voice of America stamp
 4. 1940 Samuel F.B. Morse stamp
 5. 1965 International Telecommunications Union stamp
 6. 1973 Progress in Electronics stamp with Microphone and Radio Tube
 7. 1973 Progress in Electronics stamp with Marconi Spark Coil and Spark Gap
 8. 1973 Progress in Electronics stamp with DeForest Audion
 9. 1973 Progress in Electronics stamp with Transistor
- (2019) 1983 American Inventors stamp with Edwin Armstrong (**select after you have all nine stamps**)
